



Need for the Bayhealth Route 9 FED

Traffic Difficulties in Traveling / Crossing Route 1

- Sussex County Transportation Operations Management Plan
 - Takes 2 2.5 Times as Long to Travel Route 1 During Peak Times
 - Intersection of Route 1 and Route 9
 - Insufficient to Handle Current Load
 - Drivers Should Expect to Sit Through Multiple Traffic Signals
- Challenges for Senior Drivers
 - Decreased mobility
 - Diminished Hearing and Eyesight
 - Forgetfulness
 - Medication Side Effects (i.e. slower reaction time)





- Access for Hospitals on Diversion




Clinic Location Map





Route 9 Location Summary

- Limited Services Between Georgetown and Lewes
- Highest Growth in the State, Particularly in Seniors
- Route 1 is a Barrier to Access
- Route 9 and Hudson Road Location Provides Most Convenient Access to Majority of People



Why Route 9 Location is Preferred to Georgetown

- 1. Georgetown is at Western Edge of Service Area
- 2. Route 1 Limits Access, not Distance
- 3. Majority of Service Area Population Lives East of Route 30
- 4. Minimized Negative Impact to Nanticoke Hospital

 - Improve Outcomes
 - Reduce Mortality
- Enhance Access to Behavioral Health Services
 - Time Dependent Administration for Naloxone for Overdose
