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QUARANTINE INSTRUCTIONS

Rabies is a fatal disease that is transmitted by a bite or contamination of an open wound or mucous membrane with saliva containing the rabies virus. When an animal is potentially exposed to rabies through a bite or wound, it is essential that the animal be properly quarantined to determine the health status of the animal. Therefore, it is extremely important the following instructions be closely followed:

O _Y	our animal was current on rabies vaccination at the time of possible exposure and must
	yo a 45-day quarantine.
•	If your animal has not already been seen by a veterinarian for a rabies vaccine booster, please do so immediately.

- Your animal should remain in your control or stay on your property for the next 45 days [until ______ (date)]. During this time period, the animal should not be allowed to come into contact with animals other than those residing in the household. Failure to comply will result in a fine of not less than \$100 nor more than \$200.
- If your animal shows marked behavior changes, escapes, sickens, or dies during the quarantine period, you shall immediately notify your veterinarian or the Division of Public Health (302-744-4995). Failure to comply will result in a fine of not less than \$50 nor more than \$200.

Your animal was not current on rabies vaccination at the time of possible exposure and must undergo a **6-month** quarantine.

- You will be receiving a packet in the mail from the Delaware Department of Agriculture within the
 next 7-10 days. This packet requires your immediate attention for completion of the Quarantine
 Questionnaire. Detailed instructions for the isolated home quarantine option will be provided in
 the packet.
- During the 6-month quarantine, your animal must remain in isolated quarantine on your property, except to receive veterinary care. During this time period, the animal must be cared for and handled by only one household member 18 years old or older. The animal must be confined to a cage within a spare room, or outdoor double enclosure with protection from the elements and which prevents escape. The animal should not have contact with any other people or animals. Failure to comply will result in a fine of not less than \$100 nor more than \$200.
