CONTINUING EDUCATION CREDITS

The spreadsheet above identifies workshops that have received pre-approval for CE credits by the following specific accreditation organizations: CEAP, CRCC, DCB, NCGC, & NHA. The DSAMH Training Office is an approved provider of continuing education with the following accreditation organizations: DBN, NAADAC, NASW (DE), & NBCC. Even if a workshop has been pre-approved, certain accreditation organizations may require documentation beyond the Certificates of Training normally issued by our office. Read carefully the information pertaining to each certification board listed below, in order to determine whether a specific accreditation organization will require additional documentation. If so, you will need to visit the Continuing Education station at the DSAMH Registration Desk in the hotel's lobby in order to obtain the required documentation.

CE: The DSAMH Training Office will award an individual certificate of training to each participant for completion of each workshop

EXCEPTIONS: CEU's & Certificate for the TTS workshop are awarded by the University of Massachusetts; Certificate of Attendance is awarded for 1669, which is not CEU-qualified

CEAP (EACC): Certified Employee Assistance Professional (Employee Assistance Certification Commission). See spreadsheet for workshops pre-approved for Professional Development Hours for CEAP by the EACC. **After completion of your workshop, you must present your workshop certificate to the Continuing Education Station at The DSAMH Registration Desk in the hotel's lobby**, where you will be provided with an approval number and other documentation required by the EACC in order to receive Professional Development Hours.

CRCC: Commission on Rehabilitation Counselor Certification. See spreadsheet for workshops pre-approved by the CRCC. **You must present your workshop certificate to the Continuing Education station at the DSAMH Registration Desk in the hotel's lobby** in order to receive a CRCC Participant Verification Completion Form.

DBN: Delaware Board of Nursing (DBN). The DSAMH Training Office is an approved provider of Continuing Education credits under the rules and regulations for mandatory education set forth by the DBN. The qualitative selection of course offerings is the responsibility of the individual nurse, and content must be related to the position.

DCB: Delaware Certification Board. See spreadsheet for workshops pre-approved by the DCB.

DPA: Delaware Psychological Association does **NOT** pre-approve workshops for CEU's.

NAADAC: The Division of Substance Abuse and Mental Health is an approved provider of continuing education for the National Association of Alcoholism and Drug Abuse Counselors (Provider #112). Courses leading to basic counselor training and/or personal self-improvement are not acceptable as continuing education courses.

NASW (DE): National Association of Social Workers (Delaware Chapter). See spreadsheet for workshops pre-approved by the NASW (DE).

NBCC: National Board of Certified Counselors. The DSAMH Training Office is an NBCC Approved Continuing Education Provider (ACEP™) and may offer NBCC-approved clock hours for events that meet NBCC requirements. The ACEP™ solely is responsible for all aspects of the program. Provider #5047.
