Did you know...

^{...}over 5.3 million Americans currently live with disabilities resulting from TBI.

^{...}each year in the US an estimated 1.5 million people sustain a TBI, which is 8 times the number of people diagnosed with breast cancer and 34 times the number of new cases of HIV and AIDS

^{...}that causes of TBI are diverse and include: open head injury, deceleration injuries, and closed head trauma.
