NOMINATION INSTRUCTIONS

WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

- ◆ Eligible nominees include individuals or youth groups where participants are 18 years old or younger or enrolled as a secondary school student in 2006. Individuals and groups must be engaged in volunteer activities addressing community needs within the state of Delaware.
- ◆ Nominees may not nominate themselves or be nominated by a family member.
- ◆ Previous winners (individuals or groups) are not eligible for one year.
- ◆ Nominees must have been active within the 2006 calendar year (January 1 – December 31). Nominators should include information about long-term volunteer efforts in addition to the service given in 2006.
- ◆ NOTE – Nominees selected as award winners will be recognized through the press and at an awards ceremony to be held on April 26, 2007. Nominees' names and nominator contact information will be made available to the media unless the State Office of Volunteerism receives written notification.

**A COMPLETE NOMINATION PACKET CONSISTS OF
10 COLLATED COPIES OF THE FOLLOWING MATERIALS:**

1. **Completed Nomination Form** (Page 3 of this form)
2. **Completed Narrative (maximum length - 1000 words)** Please answer all six questions—see Section E of the nomination form for further details on writing the narrative.
3. **Supplemental Materials (optional)** Supplemental materials may include photographs, letters of recommendation, testimonials, news clippings, pamphlets and other documents supporting the nominee's activities. All materials must be no larger than 8.5" x 11" and cannot exceed five pages.

Nomination packets without the required ten copies will be returned.

- ◆ Please type in 12-pt. font or neatly print the information.
- ◆ If nominating a group, include a list with each member's name and their school name(s).
- ◆ Do not submit videotapes, cassettes, display materials, film, scrapbooks, books, etc. All materials and photos submitted become the property of the State Office of Volunteerism and will not be returned.
- ◆ A good-quality digital photograph will be required for nominees selected for an award.

AWARDS WILL BE PRESENTED IN THESE ISSUE CATEGORIES:

- ◆ **Arts/Culture** – museums, performing arts, historical sites and programs; ethnic and cultural exploration or education programs; awareness and education for the arts.
- ◆ **Community Service** – volunteer service to improve a neighborhood or the community as a whole.
- ◆ **Education** – school- or community-based learning programs, early childhood development, and educational assistance at all levels.
- ◆ **Environment** – planning or implementation efforts; education; public awareness; protection or enhancement.
- ◆ **Health** – physical and mental healthcare; substance abuse prevention and rehabilitation.
- ◆ **Human Needs** – job training and placement; child care; youth and community recreation; services to the elderly, people with disabilities, families, or children; assistance to homeless and indigent persons/families; housing and short-term crisis; social services.
- ◆ **Public Safety** – assistance to victims of crime; public awareness and prevention programs; criminal rehabilitation; crisis intervention; disaster preparedness; firefighting and emergency medicine.
- ◆ **Social Justice/Advocacy** – efforts to bring together diverse groups within the community to address community issues or needs, or to promote equity and justice.

4. **DEMONSTRATION OF LEADERSHIP:** How has the nominee demonstrated responsible citizenship by pro-actively addressing societal needs and working well with others? Please explain.
5. **INNOVATION OF NOMINEE:** Has the nominee used new approaches in addressing problems? Has the nominee provided service to others in spite of unusual challenges and obstacles? Describe creativity used by nominee. Please explain.
6. **COMMITMENT TO VOLUNTEER SERVICE:** Does the nominee's effort demonstrate that volunteer service has been and will continue to be an important activity in his/her life? Please explain. List other volunteer or community service activities.
