Basilio Nicolo Bautista III Community Service Nominator: Kay Wood Bailey

Peyton Beard Community Service Nominator: Amy Donohue

As someone living with Ehlers-Danlos Syndrome, she's made it her mission to educate others about it by leading school assemblies and writing about the disease for Delaware Today. Peyton is an active volunteer at the Brandywine Zoo and the Ronald McDonald House, organized the HOPE Phone Drive, and much more.
