The State Fiscal Year has ended, and the Screening for Life (SFL) program is beginning the close-out process for State Fiscal Year 2013.

State Fiscal Year 2013 dates of service for breast, cervical, colorectal, and prostate cancer are July 1, 2012 to June 30, 2013.

IMPORTANT: Please submit all bills, reports, required screening, and diagnostic forms for dates of service July 1, 2012 through June 30, 2013 to SFL no later than **November 29, 2013**. This will allow processing and payment of valid charges before the

This will allow processing and payment of valid charges before the state fiscal year close-out period is complete.

Any claims received after **November 29, 2013** will be ineligible for reimbursement.

Please refer to your provider agreement which indicates that all claims, screening, and diagnostic forms must be submitted to the SFL program within 60 days of the date of service.

Delaware Prostate Cancer Screening Guidelines

Regular cancer screenings are an essential part of cancer prevention. The Delaware Cancer Consortium Prostate Cancer Screening recommendations are outlined below. These recommendations were developed to assist both doctors and patients with the difficult task of weighing the benefits versus the potential harm of prostate cancer screenings.

Prostate cancer recommendations:

- Do not support mass screenings
- Promote education for informed decisions
- Screening men ≥ 75 is less desirable but individualized
- Screening is not recommended for men with a life expectancy < 10 years
- Offer average risk individuals screening at 50 years with an informed decision process
- High-risk individuals should be encouraged to screen starting at ages 40 years (risk factor – several first degree relatives) or 45 years (risk factor - African American; or first degree relative, <65 years; or family or personal history of BRCA1 and BRCA2 gene)
- Prostate Specific Antigen (PSA) test with or without Digital Rectal Exam (DRE) and screening at one to two year intervals are acceptable
