Reporting	Addresses all issues associated with reporting including (a) infections mandated
	to be reported; (b) educational needs and opportunities; (c) advising DPH on the
	need for technical assistance to facilitate reporting; (d) oversight of validation
	studies and implementation of related recommendations; (e) interpretation of
	reported data; (f) issuance of recommendations to DPH and HAIAC on matters
	that should be addressed based on the reported data; and (g) facilities mandated to
	report
Membership	Maintains membership list, recruits to fill vacancies, communicates with
	members with lags in attendance, manages elections
Prevention	Assess prevention activities under way in Delaware. Advises DPH and HAIAC
	on implementation of prevention activities based on best practices. Evaluates
	impact of prevention activities. Includes hospitals and the new facilities.
Communication	Recommends web content to DPH. Addresses any media matters. Advises DPH
	on report content to assure consumer readability. Manages conferences should
	the HAIAC wish to hold any.
