What is RespondDE? RespondDE is a volunteer corps of medical and health care

professionals and other community members who give their time and expertise to prepare for and respond to public health emergencies. RespondDE is a sister organization of the national Office of the Civilian Volunteer Medical Reserve

Corps (OCVMRC) which was founded in 2002.

Purpose: RespondDE supplements existing medical and public health

staff for the prevention of and response to a public health emergency or disaster event. Roles performed by members may include mass vaccination, dispensing medications,

triaging evacuees, client transport, performing administrative

duties, or many other needed tasks.
