Dear Community Water System Administrator,

The Office of Drinking Water (ODW) is writing to share information with you for your drinking water Consumer Confidence Report (CCR) for the calendar year 2018. This document contains items below that will assist you in creating your CCR.

The CCR is required by the State of Delaware's, *Regulations Governing Public Water Drinking Systems* (16 Del. C. § 4462). The CCR provides residents of community water systems with information about their local drinking water quality.

The CCR data for your water system is compiled in the *Annual Drinking Water Quality Report* that you may generate from Delaware's Drinking Water Watch (DWW) website, <https://drinkingwater.dhss.delaware.gov/>.

To generate the *Annual Drinking Water Quality Report* (available by April 1):

- 1) Go to the DWW website by using the link above.
- 2) The DWW website opens in your web browser.
- 3) Click the "Review Consumer Confidence Data" button.
- 4) Choose your water system from the "Select Your Water System" menu.
- 5) Choose "2018" in the "Select CCR Year" menu.
- 6) Choose your preferred report format from the "Select Report Format" menu.
- 7) Click the "Generate Report" button.
- 8) A "Save" dialog box will prompt you for a location on your computer to save the report.

The purpose of the above digitally-generated *Annual Drinking Water Quality Report* is to provide you with a list of federally regulated contaminants and additional information that you must report in your compliance CCR. The *Annual Drinking Water Quality Report* is **NOT your compliance CCR**. Do not submit the digitally-generated *Annual Drinking Water Quality Report* to ODW.

Additionally, ODW will mail you a supplemental report by April 1<sup>st</sup> which contains any detections in your system for secondary contaminants regulated in Delaware. These include MTBE, nickel, manganese, iron, pH, chloride, sodium, sulfate and alkalinity. All water systems with at least 500 service connections must report these contaminants.

#### **ADDITIONAL INFORMATION FOR 2019**

- A draft CCR template is available by sending a request to [keith.harrison@state.de.us](mailto:keith.harrison@state.de.us).
- Do not report total coliform detections in your CCR. (*E. coli* detections must be reported).
- Your CCR should contain all detected contaminants from *the most recent round* of sampling in the past five years.
- The DWW generated water quality report will contain the data from the most recent round of sampling.
- Do not report a contaminant detected in previous years if the contaminant is not present in the current-year DWW report.
- Although unusual, we have found that DWW may not accurately report lead and copper data and disinfection byproducts data. For that reason, we advise you to consult DWW to review your sampling schedule for each group of contaminants to determine that DWW is reporting the most recent information.



### **IMPORTANT DATES AND INFORMATION FOR 2018**

1. Deadline to provide your CCR to your customers and ODW: **July 1, 2019.**
2. Deadline to provide your Certification of Delivery to ODW: **July 10, 2019.**

A CCR reporting violation will be issued if either of these deadlines are missed.

### **CCR SUBMISSION TO ODW**

Submit your CCR digitally to ODW. The format should be PDF or JPEG. Word or Excel files are not acceptable due to possible malware transmission. Email the digital file to:

After you digitally submit your CCR to ODW, you will receive an email confirmation. If you do not receive an email confirmation in five business days, call 302-741-8630 to confirm delivery. Alternatively, you may mail a paper copy to the address at the bottom of this page.

### **FURTHER INFORMATION FOR YOUR CCR**

The Maximum Contaminate Level (MCL) for fluoride in Delaware is 2 ppm vs. 4 ppm set by the Environmental Protection Agency. Make sure to use the Delaware Fluoride MCL and maximum contaminant level goal (MCLG) when creating your CCR.
