Patient Card Options

Option #1: Standard Patient Card

The standard patient card is use for the approved debilitating conditions: Cancer, Terminal Illness, HIV Positive, AIDS, Decompensated Cirrhosis, ALS/Lou Gehrig's Disease, Alzheimer's Disease, PTSD, Autism, Glaucoma, Migraines, Cachexia or Wasting Syndrome, Severe Pain, Intractable Nausea, Seizures, Muscle Spasms and Multiple Sclerosis

* Patients issued the Standard Patient Card may purchase any product sold at the Compassion Centers including products with elevated concentrations of THC.

Option #2: CBD Rich Patient Card

The CBD Rich patient card is use for the traditionally approved debilitating conditions listed above and for the treatment of anxiety.

The treating physician can elect the CBD Rich card whenever they feel it is appropriate, but it must be used for the treatment of anxiety.

** Patients issued the CBD Rich Card are limited to purchases of products containing low concentrations of THC and elevated concentration of CBD.

Option #3 Compassionate Use Card (CUC)

The Compassionate Use Card is for patients with a severe and debilitating condition that all current standard care practices and treatments have been exhausted and have been ineffective, or the side effects are prohibitive with continued use. The CUC is for experimental treatment and the certifying physician must re-evaluate and document the efficacy of medical marijuana treatment by following the intervals directed in the program regulations.

* Patients issued the CUC may purchase any products sold at the Compassion Centers including products with elevated concentrations of THC.
