Welcome and Roll Call	DMMA Director and CMCAC Chair, Stephen Groff welcomes everyone. Attendees announce their presence via the chat box.			
Review of CMCAC Charter and Guiding Principles	Kimberly Xavier gave a brief review of the CMCAC Charter and Guiding Principles.			
Review of 2020 Accomplishments	Kimberly Xavier reviewed the 2020 Year-End Report and asked for Committee members to review and provide feedback at a later date.			
Skilled Home Health Quarterly Report	 Kimberly gave a summary on the following: The workgroup continues to meet virtually due to the pandemic. DMMA along with a parent representative of the CMCAC presented at the national ADvancing States Home and Community Based Services (HCBS) Conference, highlighting the work done on the Family Satisfaction Survey. The Workgroup has collaborated with the University of Delaware on the PDN Workforce Capacity Study and members provided key input into the Study. The Workgroup has finalized the Family Satisfaction Survey. Workgroup members provided input into the Family Satisfaction Survey tool, which resulted in a reduction in overall survey items and changes in key areas. Final Human Subject Review Board (HSRB) approval was received for the Family Satisfaction Survey tool. Upcoming activities Finalize and post the MCO PDN Welcome Letter and What to Expect Letter on the CMC Website. Develop a 2021 work plan based upon CMCAC priorities. Distribute the Family Satisfaction Survey. Continue Work on the PDN Workforce Capacity Study. Upcoming SHHN workgroup meeting are on 1/19/21 and 2/2/21. 			
Data Workgroup Quarterly Report	 Kimberly gave a summary on the following: Workgroup remained on hiatus; however, work on the Family Satisfaction Survey continued under the purview of the Skill Home Health Nursing Workgroup. Data workgroup will develop a work plan based upon CMCAC 2021 priorities. 			

2020 End of Year Summary Report	 Kimberly gave a high-level overview of what the report will look like: Discussed having a draft for this meeting, no draft was printed Will be approximately 8 pages long with a table of contents Will discuss how the work was organized for 2019, the objectives and a summary of each objective, and the progress made towards them An overview of the objectives for 2020 will also be included in the report Kimberly will share the draft with CMCAC and will ask for feedback by the end of January 2020
	Mary Culnane from the University of Delaware shared the following:
PDN Workforce Capacity Study Update	 Study design to look at nurses in home care.
	 Survey tool will include interviews with stakeholders from various backgrounds i.e. nurses, PDN agencies and families.
	 Will also include nurses who opted not to go into home care and find out why.
	 The research team will step-back the timeline for the family survey so that families do not confuse this study with the Family Satisfaction Survey study.
	 The survey questions for the Study were developed based upon input from the SHHN workgroup, literature reviews and websites.
	 The team has submitted the HSRB draft to DMMA for a preliminary review.
Family Satisfaction Survey Update	 Cathy Coddington of Vital Research shared the following: Research team has ensured language assistance for families who do not speak English or Spanish. Family Satisfaction Survey reminder cards have been sent and are open until the end of February. Warm introductions to the survey are needed to hear from as many families as possible.
Review of 2021 Priorities	 Kimberly Xavier gave an overview of the 2021 CMCAC Priority List and will focus on accomplishing the following: Strengthening the network of home health providers. Evaluation of home-based therapies as it relates to physical therapy; speech therapy; occupational therapy etc. and determine what works and does not work. Development of another workgroup that will work to improve the work of other home care providers i.e. speech language, occupation therapists, physical therapists etc. Developing resources for families and children with medical complexity. Looking for feedback and recommendation on the priority list from Advisory Committee.
Covid-19 Update and Discussion	 Olga Goncharova-Zapata stated that children are left behind and COVID shows all the cracks in the system. Maria Olivere asked will family of CMC get the vaccine. Steve Groff responded stating that DMMA is working closely with the federal government and DPH on vaccine rollout measures. ✓ Currently includes healthcare workers, high-risk individuals and people 65 and older. ✓ Problem with the vaccine rollout is that many people are in need of the vaccine but cannot get it at the moment. ✓ May be unwise to vaccinate one person of a whole family. Or. Mpasi raise concerns that children are not being thought of for the vaccine; but home health care providers, even parents are moving up the list.

	 Steve Groff responded stating that vaccines are not being developed for children and pediatric leaders are in the process for raising awareness of the needs of this population. Vaccine delivery for COVID is separate and different from other vaccine deliveries. 	
Public Comment	 Steve Groff welcomes families to share comments with Committee. Families commented on the impact of having a child with complex me needs can have on families' livelihood. Steve Groff acknowledges the challenges families face with caring for child wit medical complexity and other life responsibilities. Thanks everyone for sharing joining the meeting.
